RULES OF CONDUCT

Respect, at all times, the rights of the property owners! When you meet landowners, introduce yourself and be courteous.

- Ride LVTA designated trails only. NEVER ride through a landowners crop.
- Observe all trail signs.
- Do not use any landowners facilities such as jumps, riding ring, etc.
- If you pass through a GATE, be sure it is closed properly.
- Group riding is limited to 6 horses.
- Keep your horse under control at all times.
- No motorized vehicles allowed on the trails.
- Do not throw **LITTER** on the trails.
- No smoking on the trails.
- If you are asked by a landowner to leave the property, do so immediately and call a LVTA officer.
- Protective riding headgear is MANDATORY while riding the trails.
- Parents are responsible for their children and mounts while they are riding on the trails.
- Be considerate of a landowners privacy.

COURTESY FOR HORSEBACK RIDERS ON SHARED TRAILS

- Help with the maintenance on the land where you ride.
- Train your horse to be around other people, other animals, bicycles and motorized vehicles.
- Let someone know where you are going & when vou will return.
- Show your gratitude to landowners.
- Park in designated/authorized parking areas only.
- Get to know other users. Talk to them and be friendly. Say hello and smile.
- Always stay on the right side of the trail (no matter how wide). This helps to avoid accidents and head-on collisions.
- Always look ahead, beside and behind you.
- When riding downhill yield to uphill traffic. Uphill traffic has the right-of-way. Always wait at the top of a hill or the first safe spot to stop until the uphill traffic has passed.

Take responsibility for yourself. You may not be able to change someone else's behavior but you can change your own.
